This includes some of our seasonal friend's addresses both in Franklin and at their other home. Birthdays and anniversaries are listed. The Mission Committee has grown this year! New people have arrived and joined our committee. But I want you to know that YOU as a member of the church or as a friend, I consider a member, because without your support we can not do what we do. In our **Budget** we support local, national and international programs: Care Net, Guatemala Partnership and the Children's Scholarship, and Black Mountain Children's Home. Our other line items are Emergency Relief which may be used for rent money, utilities, motel rooms. Two Matching Funds for our two Benefit Concerts for the Children's Home, \$5697 and Care Net, \$4062. Our biggest line item is called Mission Opportunity which goes mostly for local needs. Gas cards and Transit passes have been purchased. Also it is used to round up our Dollars projects. After Hurricane Helene, we gave \$1100 directly to WNC hurricane relief. \$10,316 went directly to Black Mountain Children's Home. This was all donated money not from our budget. We put up three homeless people for a week.

Our **Dollars Program** this year supported: No Wrong Door--\$500, Community Care Clinic--\$1000, World Central Kitchen--\$1000, Snack Sack Lunches--\$1590, Guatemala trip--\$1259. This allowed me to give \$650 to the Session of Camino a Canaan. Frank supplied me with children's T-shirts. Our last program was for WNC Hurricane Relief--\$2100. The Snack Sack Lunches is a brand new program this year conceived by Ann Beattie. Kathy Danz has coordinated this project. We are suppling the Downtown Door with sandwiches on Friday. Another new program has been started. We have had the Macon Habilities come and play Bingo and have lunch in Tartan Hall. Members of the Committee have assisted the members with their cards. They hope to come once a month in the future.

We support two **Presbyterian Offerings**: One Great Hour of Sharing--\$700 and the Joy Gift--\$900. We collect Daily Change four times a year on the 5th Sundays. This money goes to the Hunger Committee of the Presbytery. This year we sent \$900. Care Net has benefited from the Daily Change. Through your generous giving we have donated 636 pounds of food to Care Net during the year.

We have continued the Need It-Take It Coats during the cold weather. The Period Pantry continues to be a success. Both of these programs need re-suppling several times each week! We had our "Souper Bowl" lunch for Care Net in February which raised \$950. Dr. Browder continues "Sharing the Journey" twice a month, 2nd and 4th Thursdays at 2:00pm for Caretakers of Alzheimer's spouses and patients. Nancy contacted Macon Program for Progress to get children's names for Christmas presents.

Mission and Service is the Life of the church. The church is YOU. We are the hands and feet of Christ right here in Franklin, Guatemala and wherever there is a need. In 2025 we will continue to serve Christ. We begin each meeting with a devotion and prayer that God will guide us to choose programs that bring Glory to God. We welcome new members to our committee bringing new ideas.

This Sunday School Curriculum began the year using The Wired Word subscription, an inexpensive and easily led option with various topics from the weekly news with biblical references to choose from each week for discussion. Due to repetitive lessons, the decision was made to end the subscription in July and switch to book or video options, still led by class members. The number of books taken monthly increased over time, with up to 55 books being taken in one month. Please continue to donate appropriate reading matter. This year, a new service was added. Heavy paper bookmarks were designed with a Bible verse and information about First Presbyterian Church. Sara printed these on cardstock and cut to size to be inserted into each book put into the library. Thank you, Sara, for producing these bookmarks!

Royce filled in for Melissa for the weekly Bible Study, held jointly with Morrison Presbyterian Church twice a month on Thursday. Melissa began teaching again on Fridays and continued until Royce began teaching in November. A big hug and thank you to Melissa and to Royce for continuing this much appreciated group study.

The Short Story Group continued to meet monthly at Sara's home and has studied American Short Stories, a collection written by American authors, during 2024. The group has expanded in the past months with new members. If you'd like to join, it meets the third Wednesday of the month at 2:00 p.m. at Sara's home. Big shout out of thanks to Sara for her continued hosting of the group each month in her home.

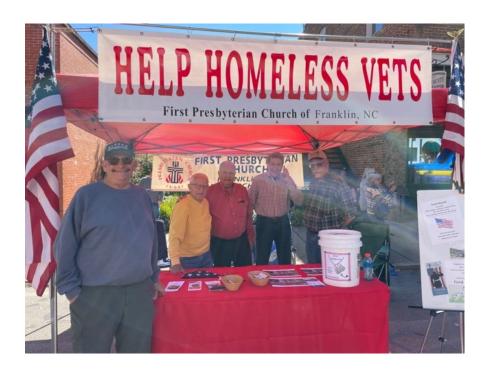
Our group meets each Thursday for lunch at various restaurants at 11:30 a.m. for fellowship. In addition, we gather on the second Saturday of each month for breakfast at 8:00 a.m. at a local designated restaurant.

During the year, the Men's Group initiated and organized three successful events that enjoyed the participation and fellowship of the congregation. They were the annual Hot Dog Luncheon fundraiser, the Nantahala Boat Trip and the Bryson City train ride on the Smokey Mountain Railroad.

The 828 Vets Organization, which our Presbyterian Men's Group supports financially, is an all-volunteer group of local veterans based here in Franklin whose mission is to provide help to those veterans who are homeless or otherwise in need. This charity organization meets weekly to identify who and how to help those less fortunate veterans. They receive no Town, State or Federal funds.

Continued:

To raise funds, which are ultimately used to help homeless veterans and veterans in need, our group has set-up and manned booths at various area festivals. We also have been successful in having the Town of Franklin approve a Proclamation designating the second week in September is "Help Homeless Veterans Week". During this week we placed 60 collection containers at area businesses and have been very successful in raising \$3,400.00. With the support of our church family, our community, local businesses and area visitors throughout the year our group was able to make a donation of \$13,200.00 to the 828 Vets Organization for 2024.

A heart felt thank you goes out to Russ Rankin for the past 3 years of dedicated service as chairman of the property team. Also a big shout out to all the team members that volunteered their time and resources on numerous successful projects throughout the year. And with the generous donations from church members and great fund drive lunches prepared under the direction of Chef Jim McInnes, it enabled us to remain under budget and comfortably overcome our challenges. **Most of all we give you thanks, O Lord.**

- A. Our year started with some interior projects in the sanctuary and admin building. Bumgarner Electric replaced 16 overhead lighting fixtures in the sanctuary. Also, light fixtures were installed in the old furnace storage closet and Frank Armato's office. Painting was completed in the admin building hallway and offices. A new AED packet was purchased and a class was held to identify proper use and where the AED packet is located. The elevated pulpit on the east side of the alter was disassembled and relocated to numerous areas around the church.
- B. Welcoming a new pastor also presented the team with a long "to do" list of maintenance items at the Manse with a "time is of the essence" completion date. The Manse had a few years of deferred maintenance that had to be completed in a couple of months. Interior painting, removing old chest freezer, washer / dryer and old microwave, removing old range hood and installing a new one, replacing downstairs flooring, repairing gutters with larger downspouts and rotten facia boards, replacing light fixtures /bulbs, plumbing

upgrades in both bathrooms, installed a new water heater, installed gutter guards, and extensive yard work requiring several loads of debris to the hauled away, plus other miscellaneous items were completed.

- C. A large pile of limbs and debris was removed from Memorial Gardens, with volunteer work days held there and at the main campus for landscape cleanup and trimming plantings. Gutter guards were installed on Tartan Hall. Continual roof leaks in the admin office building were routinely addressed as we incurred heavy rains and ponding of leaves around the roof drains. With the Manse being a major project / priority this year, pursuing a commercial roofer was tabled due to the considerable funds required.
- D. All (11) fire extinguishers throughout the church campus were inspected and tagged and (1) additional extinguisher was added in the hall between the fellowship hall and chapel.
- E. The broken limb on the bus shelter was removed allowing the bus shelter to be removed by the company that purchased it. Dead trees along the west side of the parking lot were also removed.
- F. A moveable sign was purchased to set at the front sidewalk near the drive to the rear parking lot directing traffic for all church services and special events.
- G. Ashes were placed in the Columbarium with niches being opened and closed back up.
- H. Treatment to the exterior paint on the sanctuary roof beams plus siding and the admin building siding and window trim was completed. Extensive caulking of the exposed roof beams was necessary due to long term deterioration. The high quality paint applied with primer should provide several years of life expectancy.
- I. Ongoing Manse maintenance items were addressed at the end of the year.

In closing, the property team is looking forward to Pat Mesta joining our team in 2025, and chairing a planned approach to plantings beautifying Memorial Gardens, plus hopefully reducing long term maintenance. With the support of session and our gracious congregation, we will be diligent in our continuing work conducive to the mission of the church. Please keep Property in your prayers. Thank you!
