

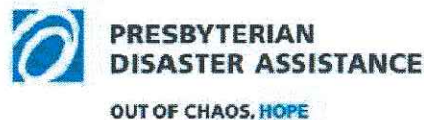
SUPPORT UKRAINE

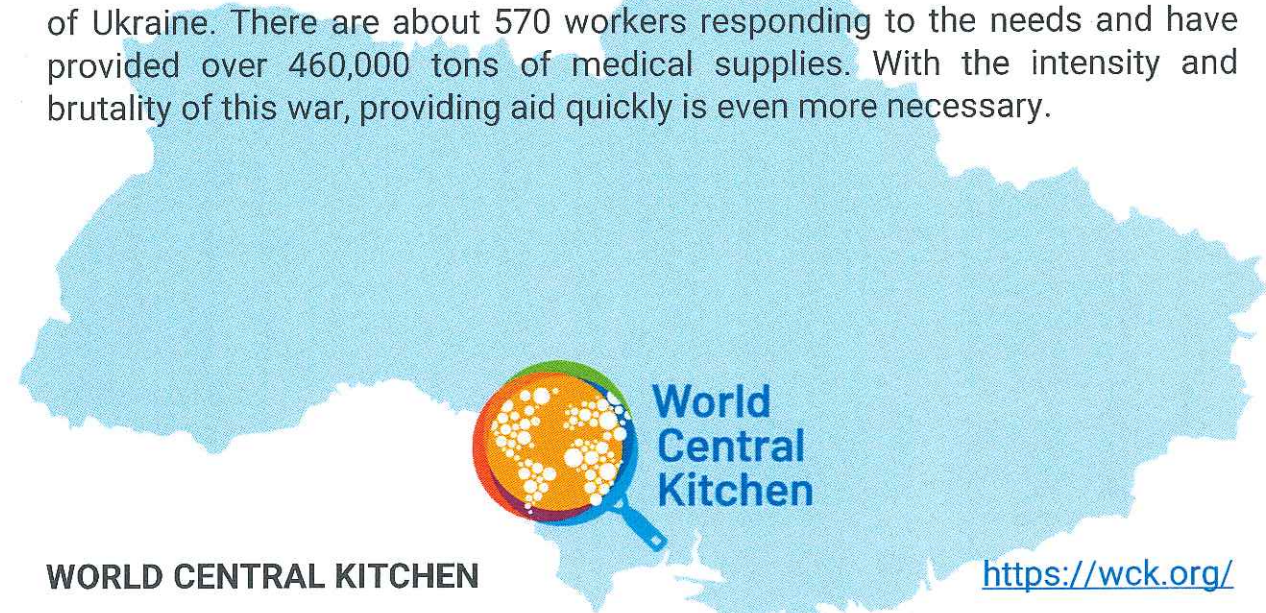
This Child Here is a validated ministry of the Presbyterian Church believing children deserve a life grounded in peace and dignity. This agency is a faith based 501 c3 non-profit supporting street kids and social orphans in Odessa and Izmail with clothes, medicine, and afterschool activities. They are sending teams into orphanages and shelters through the region to work with children on issues of Self-esteem, Identity and Life in the Community. The director, Dr. Robert Gamble has lived in Ukraine for 16 years and after his brief visit here will return to continue this work. Since this war began, This Child Here continues with the work of providing food, housing, medicine and social opportunities for children and families.

The Doctors Without Borders mission is to provide lifesaving medical care to those most in need. Since its founding in 1971, they have operated with a commitment to independence, impartiality, and neutrality. They run humanitarian projects in over 70 countries. Currently, they manage hospitals in and around Ukraine and provide medical support in at least 13 other areas of Ukraine. There are about 570 workers responding to the needs and have provided over 460,000 tons of medical supplies. With the intensity and brutality of this war, providing aid quickly is even more necessary.

World Central Kitchen is first on the frontlines, providing meals in response to humanitarian, climate, and community crises. Chef José Andrés started WCK in 2010 after the devastating earthquake in Haiti delivering food and then working with local cooks to feed and help rebuild the community. They have set up camps in Puerto Rico, Australia, the Louisiana coast among many others. Now they are working with the people in Ukraine to provide food and to work with them to prepare and deliver food to those in need. Across Ukraine and surrounding countries, they provide thousands of meals daily with 10 million pounds to over 2,000 distribution sites.
